

This letter is in reference to your request for a Zoning Permit for a special event, July 16 and 17, 2016 on a 450 acre parcel in Duncans Mills, with 80 acres being used for the event. The event is to take place from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 pm, daily. With approximately 1,500 attendees and up to 500 participants staying overnight. Food and nonalcoholic beverages will be served at this event. The Zoning Permit was posted for 10 days and no protests were received. The Zoning Permit approval is subject to the enclosed Conditions of Approval.

The Zoning Permit approval is based on a determination by the Permit and Resource Management Department (PRMD) that the use will not be detrimental to the health, safety or welfare of adjacent land uses or properties.

This Zoning Permit is approved for the use as described on the application form, the proposal statement, the site plan submitted to this department and as modified by the Conditions of Approval. Any modifications of the use, expansion or alteration shall be submitted for review and approval by PRMD in advance of the proposed change and may, at the discretion of the department, require a new Zoning Permit.

This decision may be appealed in writing, along with an appeal fee, within 10 (ten) calendar days of the date of this letter.

1. Provide at least one portable toilet per 100 people and as specified in policy 9-2-31 on the PRMD website. Portable toilets must be serviced by a licensed company. Portable toilets shall be equipped with hand washing sinks. Accessible portable toilets shall be provided at a rate of 5% (but not less than one) at each location that portable toilets are placed.

NOTE: ANY EXISTING SEPTIC SYSTEM CANNOT BE USED FOR THESE EVENTS UNLESS IT HAS BEEN THOROUGHLY REVIEWED BY THE WELL AND SEPTIC DISTRICT SPECIALIST AND HAS THE CAPACITY TO ACCOMMODATE THE INCREASED LOADING FROM THE EVENTS AND THE EXISTING USES.

- 2. The applicant shall provide an adequate number of solid waste receptacles and provide for daily litter pick-up. Containers shall be designed to prevent spillage and the entry of rodents, birds, cats or dogs. Provision for recycling and waste reduction is required, call the Eco-Desk at 565-3375 or visit the web site at www.recyclenow.org and click on "Special Events" under "Businesses".
- 3. Noise shall be controlled in accordance with the Table NE-2 (Attached) of the Noise Element of the Sonoma County General Plan.

NOTE: ANY AMPLIFIED MUSIC OR LOUDSPEAKERS SHALL BE CONTROLLED SO THAT THE IMPACT TO SURROUNDING PROPERTIES WILL BE MINIMIZED. ORIENTATION OF SPEAKERS SHALL BE AWAY FROM ANY NEIGHBORING RESIDENCES. VOLUMES SHALL ALSO BE MONITORED TO MEET COUNTY STANDARDS AT ALL TIMES. All AMPLIFIED MUSIC SHALL CEASE AT 10:00 P.M.

4. Smoking is prohibited at public events, except in designated smoking areas. If smoking areas are designated, they shall be outdoors, at least 25 feet from non-smoking areas, no more than 5% of the event area, and posted as a smoking area and equipped with ash trays or ash cans. All dining areas, enclosed areas and areas where the public waits for entry or to be served shall be posted as "No Smoking."

5. Other:

(a) Comply with conditions of Environmental Health, Consumer Protection regarding food and beverage service. Catering services must be used.

- B. The use of portable toilets shall meet the following minimum requirements:
- 1. An adequate number of portable toilets shall be provided, but in no case shall the number of portable toilets be less than one toilet per one hundred (100) visitors per day for day use, and six toilets per one hundred (100) visitors per day if overnight use is included.
- 2. Portable hand washing facilities shall be provided with all portable toilets used for serving visitors or the public. Employees serving food to visitors or the public must have access to permanently plumbed running hot and cold water sinks plumbed to an OWTS or public sewer.
- 3. Portable toilets shall be serviced as needed, but in no case less than once every seven days.
- 4. The applicant shall provide an accessible portable restroom on the job site where required by Federal, State or local law, including but not limited to, requirements imposed under OSHA, the Americans with Disabilities Act or Fair Employment and Housing Act.
- 5. Portable toilets shall not be brought on-site prior to 48 hours before the Special Event and shall be promptly serviced and removed within 48 hours after the Special Event.
- 6. If complaints are received that PRMD believes are valid complaints, the applicant or current operator of the Use Permit shall increase the number of portable toilets and/or increase the frequency of maintenance of the portable toilets for the remainder of the Special Event and at future Special Events as directed by PRMD. The property owner and his agent(s) are expected to maintain portable toilets and hand washing units so that:
 - a. The holding tank does not leak or overflow.
 - b. Toilet paper is promptly replaced when the dispenser runs out.
 - c. Water and soap is promptly replaced when the hand washing units run out.
 - d. The wait to use a portable toilet shall not be so long that people relieve themselves at other impromptu locations. e. Reliance upon portable toilets shall not create a public nuisance.



The California Historical Artillery Society

The California Historical Artillery Society (C.H.A.S.) is a private non-profit educational living history organization dedicated to preserving the history of our nations mounted artillery traditions. Armed with four full-scale muzzle loading artillery pieces, supply wagons, limbers, a caisson, an ambulance and a stable of more than thirty horses, C.H.A.S. can accurately portray regular U. S. Army artillery from the 1840's through 1918. This time period stretches through four significant periods in American History: The Mexican-American War, the Civil War, The Spanish-American War and WWI. Members of C.H.A.S. receive a real feeling for army life in the 19th century, whether it be servicing and firing muzzle loading artillery pieces as cannoneers or harnessing and driving the artillery teams which pull the cannons. A civil war era civilian impression has been added called "the United States Sanitary Commission". This organization helped to improve the health of Union Army soldiers and gathered supplies to provide for the troops. All aspects of army life are portrayed.

C.H.A.S. also has a Standard Bred Horse Rescue Program and currently has over thirty horses, which were destined for an unpleasant end. These equine mostly ex-trotter Standard Bred horses are used by C.H.A.S. to pull the wagons and limbers and live a very pleasant life at Camp Warhorse. Camp Warhorse is a ranch of green pastures surrounded by white fences and the pleasant climate of the Salinas Valley.

The California Historical Artillery Society has captivated audiences all over the country with its horse drawn teams. It participates in special events such as parades, military funerals and living history celebrations of all kinds. The organization has been seen at Camp Reynolds at Angel Island and many other reenactments from Northern California to the battlefields of Pennsylvania, Maryland and Virginia.

PUBLIC ATTENDANCE: Expect 1,500 / day, Event Total Attendance = 3,000

RE-ENACTMENT ACTIVITIES:

CIVILIAN RE-ENACTORS:

The Civilian encampment will consist of 100 to 150 re-enactors (see Event Site Plan for location). Their camp will be supplied with seasoned firewood, straw (for sleeping mattresses) and potable water for drinking. Portable toilets with sinks will be available in all camps adjacent to living areas. The Re-enactors will be living on site for two days. They will be sheltered in period canvas tents, cooking over open pit fires (fire water always available) with period utensils. The civilian living history activities will include period dance demonstrations, blacksmith demonstrations and sales, period photographic services, clothing seminars and other living history activities. Period Merchants will also be on site in canvas tents selling their wares.

MILITARY RE-ENACTORS: There will be two military camps, one Federal, one Confederate. They too will be living on site for two days and will have access to straw, firewood and water. Toilet facilities will be located within their camping area (see site plan for layout). There will be detachments of Infantry, Cavalry and Artillery at each

camp. Firearms will never be loaded with live ammunition and will be kept unavailable to the public. No real combat is intended during any of the battle scenarios, but rather mock combat intended to represent the actual tactics and effects of battle experienced in the American Civil War. Twice daily battles are planned. Ground charges are planned for use during the mock battles and will be remotely controlled. Each battle should last approximately 45 minutes. At this time only the re-enactors will be allowed on the battlefield. The public will be confined to a roped off viewing area which will be monitored by provosts during this time.

HORSES / VET SERVICES: The Union and Confederate cavalry, as well as, the Union Artillery will have horses on site. Adequate feed, routine maintenance and medical care is the responsibility of the individual owners. The event sponsor will provide water for all horses and arrange to have a large animal vet on call for this weekend. The horses will be kept under the control of the re-enactors at all times.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND EMERGENCY SERVICES:

MEDICAL AND FIRE SERVICES: The Monte Rio Volunteer Fire Dept. under the supervision of Chief Steve Baxman has agreed to provide all Fire and Medical Services for the event. Chief Baxman expects to have additional fire dept. jurisdictions on site and available. The battlefield offers ample space for emergency helicopter landings should that become necessary. There are adequate roads to reach all parts of the site in the event of Fire or Medical emergency. Chief Baxman is aware of our intention to use ground charges during the battle scenarios and raised no objections before signing off on the event.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC PLAN: We do not expect to cause any road closures. We intend to have road signs at the intersection of Highway 116 and Moscow Rd. directing the public toward the event site and the parking available there. We will post "No Parking" signs along the Moscow Rd. bridge and Freezeout Rd. leading to the event site. Our print advertising will, as much as possible, indicate "On site parking available" and give direct and precise directions to the site. We wish to avoid congestion and inconvenience to the area as much as possible. Our written instructions, radio ads and posted signs will direct traffic, most of which will approach Duncans Mills from Highway 116, to turn onto Moscow Rd. bridge, go to the end of the bridge and make a sharp right turn onto Freezeout Rd. At Freezeout Rd., which is a lightly traveled narrow two way road, we will have another sign indicating "Civil War Days" with an arrow pointing in the direction of the site. About 1/4 of a mile down the road, on the left is our 1st gate (Casini Rd.) which will be posted with a sign indicating that this is where "Union, Confederate, and Civilian Re-enactors, merchants and concession people" should enter to set up. We will also indicate on this sign that "Public and Re-enactor Parking" must proceed further down Freezeout Rd. We will have "No Parking" signs along Freezeout Rd. A few hundred yards farther down is our 2nd gate (at the Mendocino Redwood Co. Rd.) which will be posted with a sign saying "Public and Re-enactor Parking" with an arrow indicating that they turn here. We will have a radio equipped traffic control person here ushering cars onto the MRC road during public hours. Cars will be directed to the Entry point of the public parking lot, where a parking attendant (a barricade across the road will prohibit further progress) will direct them into the area

designated Public Parking (see Event Site Plan enclosed). We will charge \$5 per car for parking and direct the public through traffic cone designated lanes to parking areas. Handicapped parking will be available and posted directly adjacent to the Event entry. We will have the Masonic organization "Jobs Daughters" acting as parking lot staff. There will be adult supervision. Our staff will be walkie talkie equipped and in touch with the Event Coordinator, Medical, Fire and Security people. Road signs located on the Mendocino Redwood Co. and Casini road before and after the public hours will be adequate to direct the re-enactors to the Re-enactor parking (a separate designated area noted on the enclosed Event Site Plan). Backup Parking for 1,000 cars is available at the Rodeo Grounds for both public and re-enactors with shuttle service (by a licensed transit co.) being available to the event site. No re-enactor cars are allowed within the encampment during public hours.

SECURITY AND CROWD CONTROL: The event site is approximately 80 acres of mostly flat, fenced meadows. The public will see from the parking lot and "Entrance" sign where they will cross a foot bridge and enter the admissions area. We will have adequate staff to accept the admission donations, provide site maps and event information. The public is then free to walk through the site. Where small creeks occur (almost completely dry at that time of year) existing earth bridges or foot bridges will provide crossing for the public, who typically walk from one encampment to another. They will have free and available access to the re-enactor areas (that's the whole point of this event!) A half hour before the battle scenarios, we escort them out of the military camps and direct them into the viewing and civilian area. This area will be roped off and patrolled by provosts (re-enactors and/or Boy Scouts) who will keep the public off the battlefield during the twice daily scenarios. The fenced meadows define the visitor areas except for a sloping meadow along the north side of the civilian encampment. We will rope this area off, post "Do Not Enter" signs and provide walkie talkie equipped patrol to keep people off the slope. We will post signs prominently, which direct the public to keep out of prohibited areas!!! We will have a mounted Security presence (Russian River Rodeo Assoc. to provide this service) who will perform patrol duty throughout the site. The California Historical Artillery Society intends to make regular pickups at cash collection points, such as, parking, admissions, concessions, etc.... and daily bank deposits in order to minimize the amount of cash kept on site.

MUSIC:

MUSIC: There will be no amplified live music. Small acoustical groups only will be playing periodically. We will have a PA system for public announcements and some narration for event activities.


FOOD AND BEVERAGES:

FOOD, SODA AND WATER: We expect to sell hot dogs, polish sausages and hamburgers, canned sodas and bottled water. The sales will be conducted by Casini Ranch Family Campground staff, an experienced and licensed food preparer. There are refrigeration facilities on site. The food preparer will provide their own cooking and serving facility. The eating area is amidst a shaded area complete with power, picnic tables and adequate covered refuse containers. Nightly pickups of refuse will be made.

Large quantities of potable drinking water will be immediately available for food preparation and cleanup. Potable water will be supplied by Casini Water Tenders of Duncans Mills and will consist of (1) water buffalo or water truck per encampment. Refilling will occur as required. This water will be for horses as well. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: The California Historical Artillery Society does not intend to sell alcoholic beverages at it's event this year.

PORTABLE TOILETS:

RESTROOM FACILITIES: (36) portable toilets are to be located throughout the site. Our expectation of 2,000 people per day (1,500 public and 500 re-enactors) is well within Sonoma County's ratio of (1) toilet per 100 people. We have reserved (24) regular, (6) deluxe w/ sinks and (6) handicap toilets. They will be delivered no later than Weds. July 11th and will be removed after the event is over. We are contracting to have them emptied Saturday morning and Sunday morning. We currently have made arrangements with Redwood Sanitary Service, 433-7810. Please see the "Event Site Plan" for toilet locations and distribution.
