



The California Department of Parks and Recreation would like to submit a Coastal Permit Application for the Red Hill Trail Project, located at Sonoma Coast State Beach. This is a new hiking trail, (approx. 2½ miles) that will create loop trail opportunities originating from the popular Pomo Canyon Trail (Pomo Campground to Shell Beach). Additionally, the proposed trail will provide access to the newly acquired Red Hill Property. The project will be primarily new trail construction, with some road/trail re-construction, and obliteration of unwanted trails. The only structure proposed is a wood trail bridge over a seasonal drainage. All construction will be performed in-house by an experienced trail crew, following Department approved trail construction standards and guidelines. A Notice of Exemption has been filed to complete the CEQA process.



PROPOSED BRIDGE SITE WITH CLOSE UP VIEW OF 5 REAM CHANNEL.





PROPOSED BRIDGE TE LOCKING UPSTREAM FROM LEFT BANK










TRAIL TREAD REHABILITATION





Today we received notice of an application for a new public access hiking trail and a bridge over a "seasonal drainage" below Red Hill and above Bridgehaven. It appears that this application was made in February, this notice was mailed to us July 28 and is the first notice we have received. A decision is to be made August 11, giving us 11 days to respond, 4 of those days fall on a weekend.

This plan would have serious consequences for Bridgehaven as this watershed is our water source. We hold water rights, permit number 12988, application number 19470, license number 9372 for the "unnamed stream" which surfaces below and to the north of Red Hill and runs downhill to Bridgehaven.

This water supplies eleven lots and residences on Willow Creek Road, the Sizzling Tandoor Restaurant, five permanent occupancy cabins, and a 41 space Trailer Park with a live-in population of 16 persons, the other spaces are storage with irregular usage. The Water Treatment Operator is Jaime O'Bryan, available at fax number 707-865-2473, and he lives on-site.

The Pacific View Water Company has received the 7/28/04 notice for trail development (file # CPN04-0001, parcel #s 097-160-001, -002 and 099-060-018) at 9000 Hwy 1 Jenner.

Owners of the Pacific View Water Company have the following concerns about the proposed coastal permit to construct a new public access hiking trail connecting to the Red Hill Outlook trail:

We are concerned that the proposed public trail access will compromise the security of our water tank. This is our water company's only tank and is the only source of water for 9 homes (2 of these homes are park ranger residences). Currently there is no fence enclosure around the water tank and no signs are posted that the tank is private property. As private land a fence was not required, but now that the red hill land is being opened to the public a fence will be required and we would like to know who will help us pay for this fence.

We are concerned that the new trail will increase the possibility of fire danger in the area. Our water tank is a wooden structure and would be destroyed in a fire. Our water company fire insurance premium will inevitably go up with the public access being opened to red hill. What is being planned with the new trail to mitigate fire risk? If we are required to install a concrete tank to mitigate the fire risk who will help us pay for this new tank?

We want to be assured that there will be no re-direction of there natural water run offs and that nothing will be done to contaminate them. For example we do not want herbicides used to clear the trails that may run off into the spring, and we do not want the public bathing in the springs or using them for bathroom purposes, etc.

Redhill Loop Trail Project - State Parks

Dear Mr. Zanini:

As Conservation Chair for the Dorothy King Young Chapter of the California Native Plant Society (CNPS), I have reviewed the Planning Application for the proposed Redhill Loop Trail. CNPS is concerned that a Categorical Exemption was not appropriate for this trail project.

The documents do not indicate that seasonal plant and wetland surveys were conducted, so we wonder how the trail proponents can justify a Categorical Exemption under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): It is our hope that Sonoma County's Coastal Permit office will consider our comments carefully.

This project certainly requires seasonally appropriate biological surveys, as well as wetland delineation: CNPS members who are familiar with the project site believe that CNPS List 1-B plants may be affected. These are Species of Concern for the Department of Fish and Game (DFG), even if not state or federally listed.

There is no way to tell from the plaining application whether the type of trail planned is appropriate for the natural habitat on the site. For example, CNPS supports the use of boardwalks through wetland areas.

CNPS has also gathered from the Coastwalk newsletter that State Parks is working actively with Coastwalk and the Coastal Conservancy to develop a comprehensive trail proposal that would involve all of the Sonoma coastal State Parks, from Salt Point south.

We are very concerned that this larger project could also be approved via a Categorical Exemption, which would be very inappropriate, and perhaps could be challenged in court.

It is most regrettable that State Parks would place outdoor recreation ahead of resource protection, but that is what seems to be happening here. With careful planning and environmental review, we believe both interests can be accommodated.

Please keep us informed as to Sonoma County's determination on this project. CNPS would like to see full environmental review, with botanical surveys and wetland delineations. The Redhill Loop Trail project may seem like a small project, but it could set a dangerous precedent.



In March of 2004, we received correspondence from the California Native Plant Society, via your office. Essentially this letter questioned the seasonal plant survey that was conducted as part of the project. We understand that the coastal permit processing has been suspended until we could re-examin 'his issue.

We have enlisted the services of Barry Baba, Restoration Ecologist to conduct another round of seasonal plant surveys for the project. Attached is the plant list of species found by Mr. Baba. Surveys were conducted on April 5<sup>th</sup>, April 30<sup>th</sup>, and May 31<sup>st</sup> of 2004. No rare or endangered plants were found in the area.

We are hopeful you can continue to process this permit so that we can begin preparations to implement the project. If you have any questions, I can be reached at 707-869-2374.
